2008 TSQ SUNSHINE COAST CHAMPIONSHIPS—19-22 SEPTEMBER—TEWANTIN T.C.

The inaugural seniors tennis tournament on the weekend of September 19-20, organized by Tennis Seniors Queensland as the second ITF ranking tournament in the state, was a great success with almost 200 participants from around Australia and overseas playing.

The Tewantin Tennis Club was the host venue for this event. However, with the large number of entries, some matches were played at Noosa Tennis Club and Noosa Springs Tennis Club.

Local Sunshine Coast players who won events in their particular age group were 35 Mens singles—Steve Williams; 40 Mens singles—Jamie Fletcher; 65 Mens singles—Ivor Reynolds; 50/55 Ladies singles—Fiona David; 40 Mens doubles—Steve Williams and Jamie Fletcher; 45 Mens doubles Steve Rafter and Daniel Lane; 65 Mens doubles—Don Anderson and John S Walker; 45 Ladies doubles—Di Swan and Roslyn Hand.

Jamie Fletcher won his final 6/3, 6/0 against Michael Russell from Brisbane who has recently been named in the Australian team to play in Turkey due to a late withdrawal. Steve Williams won from Lynton Joseph of Melbourne 6/2, 6/3. Ivor Reynolds had a long hard match and finally emerged the winner 6/4, 3/6, 6/4 over John S Walker from the Gold Coast. Fiona David had the longest match of the weekend (almost three hours) finally winning 4/6, 7/5, 6/3 from her opponent Roslyn Hand from the Gold Coast.

In the doubles, the local pairing of Steve Williams and Jamie Fletcher won the 40 Mens doubles, as did Steve Rafter and Daniel Lane in the 45 Mens doubles, although Steve and Daniel had to survive a tie breaker to get the title.

At least 10 of the players participating will be travelling to Turkey next month, as members of the Australian team, for the World Seniors team and individual championships. This is a major event with 330 teams from 50 countries participating in this ITF organized event at two resorts on the Mediterranean where there are more than 100 courts on the two complexes.

Funds to assist with the staging of this TSQ Sunshine Coast Championships were provided by the Noosa Council as one of its last grants under the then events funding program assisting sporting bodies.

Congratulations to Dianne and hope she continues to support Seniors tennis.



We would like to offer our warmest congratulations to all Australian players who have performed so incredibly well on the World Senior's stage in Turkey, where 323 teams played last week in 19 separate Cup Events. In particular we can be justifiably proud of our men's teams in winning two of the Cups ... the Austria Cup (again) and the Mulloy Trophy.

Our ladies also performed extremely well. Runners-up in the Bueno Cup and the Connolly Cup and players finishing in the third spot in the Marble Cup, the Gibson Cup and the Queen's Cup.

AGAIN OUR CONGRATULATIONS ARE OFFERED TO ALL PLAYERS FOR THIS GRAND EFFORT IN TURKEY.

The Austria Cup was first presented by the Austrian Tennis Federation in 1977 for competition for men in the 55 Age Group. We won this Trophy in Perth in 2005, in Durban, South Africa in 2006, in Manavgat, Turkey in 2007 and again this year in Turkey. Australia has now won this prestigious trophy nine times. Our team members this year were Andrew Rae (VIC) as Captain, Max Bates (QLD) and Russell Watts (VIC).

The Gardnar Mulloy Cup, presented for the first time in 1996 to the winning team of the Super-Seniors World Team Championships for men in the 80 Age Group. Originally donated by Gardnar Mulloy to start a new Men's 80 Competition between North America and Europe prior to this event becoming an ITF Team Competition in 1996. The United States have dominated this competition over the years, however, Australia did win this Cup in 2002 and to our players delight ... again last week. Our Team members were Doug Corbett (NSW) as Captain, Ward Hillier (VIC), Neville Halligan (QLD) and Neale Hook (QLD).



OBITUARY—GLEN SHEIL—Politician, Doctor

Glen was born in Sydney on 21 October 1929 of academic parents who produced four doctors and a dentist. He was one of the doctors and went through Queensland University after earlier education at The Southport School, in Hobart and Silverton State which was near Somerset Dam. After his 1953 university graduation, he married a fellow doctor Marjorie Sword who died of cancer in 1989 after virtually becoming a human guinea pig by taking untested treatments. But before her death, the Sheils built up large medical practices and bought a private hospital in Milton in Brisbane and advocated that a medical centre be attached to it. And it was this medical career that led Dr Sheil into federal politics although for years he had been a big player in the then Country Party, an unusual attachment for a medico as doctors usually supported the Liberal Party. He decided that the only way he could halt some of the changes proposed by the Whitlam government was to move into politics which he did in 1974. He served on the Senate from then until 1990 except for a three-year stint when he resigned to contest a House of Representatives seat.

Over the years after he was defeated in 1990, he was seen occasionally at political rallies, including one at Ipswich organized by Pauline Hanson. And he remained a staunch monarchist, participating in the 1998 Constitutional Convention. The Queensland National Party senator Barnaby Joyce described Dr Sheil as an enthralling and intelligent person who had a "very political mind".

Throughout his life, he was a keen sportsman and as a former president for ten years of Greater Brisbane Hardcourt Tennis, was a visionary. He proposed a multimillion-dollar redevelopment of the then ageing Milton tennis centre in the early 1980's which would have pre-dated the Melbourne Tennis Centre—now home to the Australian Open. The privately funded proposal included covered courts, with a special marquee centre court, undercover parking and a 20-storey hotelmotel, which would allow country children and their families to access "the big smoke" at "reasonable rates". The plan was scuttled in 1984 by the then Queensland Lawn Tennis Association president Geoff Griffith, who claimed Milton needed to retain its grass courts for Australia's Davis cup ties.

Three years later, Tennis Australia switched from grass to Rebound Ace hardcourts around the country and Milton ceased as a tennis centre in the mid-1990's and was eventually sold to developers to pay off the QLTA's massive debts. After the redevelopment was shelved, Dr Sheil resigned from the QLTA as well as stepping down as GBHTA president.

He and wife Marjorie did not have children. Two years after Marjorie's death, he remarried and is survived by his wife, Elizabeth.
