Australia's four winning performances were as follows:

The **Margaret Court Cup** is presented annually to the winning team for women in the 45 Age Group. It was first presented by the Veterans Tennis Club of Western Australia, in honour of Margaret Court in 1994. Our winning team members were Ros Balodis (ACT) as Captain, Paula Bongetti (VIC), Gwen Weightman (VIC) and Kaye Nealon (NSW). This was Australia's second victory in this event.

The **Maureen Connolly Cup** is presented annually to the winning team for women in the 55 Age Group and was first presented by the Maureen Connolly Brinker Foundation in 1992. Our team members were Kerry Ballard (NSW) as Captain, Carol Campling (NSW) and Liz Allan (NSW). These girls won this Trophy last September and this back to back victory makes our third win over the years.

The **Fred Perry Cup** was donated in honour of the late Fred Perry in 1991 for competition for men in the 50 Age Group. Australia won this Cup last year after being runner-up in the previous three years!!! This back to back victory gave a lot of pleasure to team member Andrew Rae (VIC) who played in all of these five occasions. Bruce Osborne (VIC) was Captain this year and the other team members were Wayne Pascoe (NSW) and Rod Wurtz (VIC).

The **Austria Cup** was first presented by the Austrian Tennis Federation in 1977 for competition for men in the 55 Age Group. Our fist victory for eleven years, Australia has now won this prestigious trophy six times. Team Members were Alan Gooch (WA) as Captain, Lito Alvarez (WA), **Max Bates (QLD)** and Peter Rigg (WA).

# <u>COME TO THE 2006 AUSTRALIAN TENNIS VETS CHAMPIONSHIPS IN NEW</u> <u>ZEALAND</u> CHRISTCHURCH - 8 TO 20 JANUARY.

TVA have provided the following information regarding the above Championships.

<u>AIR FARES</u>. It will be necessary for early bookings to ensure reasonable fares. Last month, travel costs with Qantas, Melbourne to Christchurch were about AUS\$340 return, which is maybe half of a "normal fare". You should keep on eye on the Qantas webpage and keep checking to get the optimum deal.

<u>ACCOMMODATION</u>. Along Papanui Road just 1/2km from the CBD there are about 15 to 20 Hotel/Motels. This location seems admirable from a convenience viewpoint, just 2 kms to the Hagley Park Tennis Club, 4 kms to Wilding Park Tennis Centre and 6 kms to the Cashmere Tennis Club.

Accommodation costs vary. Older, smaller accommodation is cheaper with the newer units available at the other end of the scale. Bookings would probably need to be made at the latest by mid-year. Singles accommodation will be available at Canterbury University, bed and breakfast, but we will need to make a group booking. If interested, please call Coral 3349 4339.

Obviously it may help you to chat with your favourite tourist agent, who is in the position of providing brochures and maybe suggest other options. Additionally if you have thoughts of touring after the Championships there are many possibilities available.

<u>TENNIS</u>. The main center will be Wilding Park (46 courts). Other centers to be used will be Hagley Park (30 courts) and Cashmere (13 courts.

<u>TRAVEL</u>. David Blackwell (NZ) suggests that it will be difficult to justify providing a comprenensive transport service. However, this matter is under review. His recommendation is that taxis are readily available and small car hire starts at about NZ\$25 a day.

FINANCE. Currently the Australian dollar will buy NZ\$1.08 or Aus\$0.92 to the NZ\$.

For those players interested in nominating for 2006, you will require a passport to travel to New Zealand. Nomination forms will be forwarded at the end of June. A list of accommodation provided by TVA is included with this newsletter. TVQ may have some further information on accommodation at a later date—please contact Coral.

#### OBITUARY LESTER HANCOCK 1912 TO 2005

With the passing of Lester Hancock in March, Queensland tennis has lost one of its most beloved players and administrators.

Lester first made his mark as a player but, like many of his era, his playing career was curtailed because of World War II.

Lester won the first Queensland Schoolboy Championship in 1925 and represented Queensland in the Linton Cup for three successive years. In 1937, he replaced Gar Moon as Queensland's No 1 Ranked player, a ranking he held until the outbreak of the war.

Lester achieved a footnote in tennis history in 1938. In that year's Australian Open, he lost 6/2 6/3 6/4 in the first round to Don Budge. Budge went on to win the tournament, defeating John Bromwich 6/4 6/2 6/1 in the Final. Budge then won the French Open, Wimbledon and US Open to become the first player to win the Grand Slam. Thus Lester was the first leg of the first Grand Slam. Budge was so dominant that, of the 24 players he defeated to win the Grand Slam in 1938, only 6 were able to win more games than Lester and only 4 were able to win a set.

Lester started his career in tennis administration around 1945. In that year he became the Central Qld Delegate on the QLTA (Tennis Queensland) Country Board and was elected as a QLTA Councillor (positions he held until 1984). He served on the State Selection Panel from 1945 to 1982 (38 years). Lester was also a long term member of the QLTA Board ofDirectors (until his retirement in 1982).

Lester was the Queensland Manager of the Spalding Sporting Goods Co for many years. He also worked as a tennis journalist and radio commentator.

Lester's contribution to the game of Tennis was recognized by Tennis Qld in 1979 with Honorary Life Membership and in 1988 with a short biography in "The Adminstrators" section of its centennial book *A Century of Queensland Tennis*.
